The Classical Greek minor consists of 25 credit hours of course work in Greek above the 103 level with at least five hours at the 600 level, and 15 hours of prerequisites. The prerequisite and minor course lists are below.

Classical Greek minor program guidelines

The following guidelines govern this minor.

Required for graduation No

Credit hours required A minimum of 25 (in addition to 15 prerequisite hours)

Transfer credit hours allowed A maximum of 10

Overlap with the GEC Permitted, unless specifically disallowed by an individual minor program.

Overlap with the major Not allowed and

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The same courses cannot count on the minor and on the major.

Overlap between minors Each minor completed must contain 20 unique hours.

Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative point-hour ratio required for the minor.

- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.

Approval required The minor program description sheet indicates if the minor course work must be approved by:

- The academic unit offering the minor

Filing the minor program form The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college or school counselor.

Changing the minor Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by:

- The academic unit offering the minor
