II.A. CCI Subcommittees: Membership, Charges, and Reporting

Membership for all CCI subcommittees consists of approximately one-fourth of the CCI membership, as well as an appointed faculty member from a professional college, an ASC Advising and Academic Services advisor, and a student from the Arts and Sciences Student Council.

Agendas for all CCI subcommittees are generated by the Curriculum and Assessment Office, in consultation with the appropriate subcommittee chair, the CCI chair, and the director of the Curriculum and Assessment Office. All subcommittee recommendations that must go on to the full CCI will be placed on the CCI agendas by the Curriculum and Assessment Office.

There are four subcommittees of the CCI: Interdisciplinary Initiatives; Arts and Humanities; Social, Behavioral, Biological, Physical and Mathematical Sciences; and Assessment.

Interdisciplinary Initiatives Subcommittee (formerly Subcommittees A & D)

- oversees programs and programmatic and curricular development of interdisciplinary initiatives (See Appendix 2.A. for submission guidelines), including the approval and assessment of interdisciplinary majors and minors and will vet all interdisciplinary courses and curricula. Due to the nature of interdisciplinarity, the Interdisciplinary Initiatives subcommittee may choose to report courses and curricula of note to the full CCI and request further action.
- awards grants for Interdisciplinary Curricular Enhancement and will report on these awards to the CCI. (See Appendix 2.B for additional information.)
- considers and vets new Clusters, Freshman Seminars, Professional Pathways Seminar curricula and assists in the development and monitoring thereof. No additional levels of review are necessary. An annual report on these initiatives will be provided to the CCI.
- oversees ASC Freshman Common Book Experience selection and program in conjunction with faculty coordinator and reports selection to full CCI, which will stand as a motion for a formal CCI vote

Arts and Humanities GEC and Program Subcommittee (formerly Subcommittee B)

- considers all new courses seeking GEC status and may assess existing GEC courses in the following categories:
 - Writing and Related Skills
 - Foreign Language category
 - Arts and Humanities sub-categories of the Breadth category
 - Historical Studies category
 - International Issues component of the Diversity Experiences category
- For GEC courses, the subcommittee reviews the course proposal packets as well as the guidelines for the appropriate GEC category or categories from the GEC Submission Guidelines (rev. 2008), the *Model Curriculum* and the *1994 Revised GEC Guidelines*. All newly approved GEC courses will be reported to the full CCI at regularly scheduled meetings.
- If the course is not approved for inclusion in the GEC, the chair of the subcommittee will contact the proposer or department directly, outlining the committee's concerns.

- vets all new and revised curricular program proposals from the College of the Arts and the College of Humanities and recommends action (which may stand as a motion to approve) to the full CCI.*

Social, Behavioral, Biological, Mathematical and Physical Sciences GEC and Program Subcommittee (formerly Subcommittee C)

- considers all new courses seeking GEC status and may assess existing GEC courses in the following categories:
 - Quantitative and Logical Skills
 - Natural Science
 - Social Science
 - Issues of the Contemporary World (597s)
 - Social Diversity in the United States component of the Diversity Experiences category
- For GEC courses, the subcommittee reviews the course proposal packets as well as the guidelines for the appropriate GEC category or categories from the GEC Submission Guidelines (rev. 2008), the *Model Curriculum* and the *1994 Revised GEC Guidelines*. All newly approved GEC courses will be reported to the full CCI at regularly scheduled meetings.
- If the course is not approved for inclusion in the GEC, the chair of the subcommittee will contact the proposer or department directly, outlining the committee’s concerns.
- vets all new and revised curricular program proposals from the College of Biological Sciences, the College of Mathematical and Physical Sciences, and the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences and recommends action (which may stand as a motion to approve) to the full CCI.*

Assessment Subcommittee (formerly Subcommittee E)

- oversees assessment plan for the Colleges of the Arts and Sciences including all GEC course and categorical level assessment. The committee works with the ASC Director of Curriculum and Assessment and University Level Advisory Committee on GEC on these issues.
- faculty on this committee will also serve on University Level Advisory Committee on GEC
- oversees assessment of ASC major programs including ASC Student Exit Survey and annual major program reports
