## ASC Major 40-80 hours

Your major program must consist of at least 40 hours of credit in courses numbered 200 or above as prescribed by your faculty adviser. Hours required vary with the major program selected. Students majoring in an ASC foreign language and in international business are not required to take the nine hours of major electives in the international business major. Courses used on the Business core requirements or the Business specialization cannot be counted on the ASC major.

## BUS Specialization 20-31 hours

Hours vary depending on the specialization selected. The BSBA economics specialization requires Econ 501 and 502; finance also requires Acct&MIS 521 and 522. Students majoring in an ASC foreign language and in international business are not required to take the nine hours of major electives in the international business major.
