The Swahili minor provides students the opportunity to study language, history, literature, and culture of Swahili speaking peoples of Eastern Africa.

The minor in Swahili consists of 15 hours of pre-requisite courses and 15 hours of course work beyond the pre-requisites. The purpose of the pre-requisites is to give students a basis in the language and culture upon which to build an understanding of the Swahili speaking world that is no longer limited to its cradle on the Swahili coast.

The selection of courses by students needs to be made with the counsel of an academic advisor. Students should be aware that not all of the courses that are available for the Swahili minor are offered every semester or year; thus early and careful planning is advised.

**The Swahili Language and Culture Minor will be 15 credit hours, as follows:**

**Swahili Language and Culture minor program guidelines**

Required for graduation No

Credit hours required A minimum of 15 credit hrs. 1000 level courses shall not be counted in the minor.

Transfer and EM credit hours allowed A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

Overlap with the major and additional minor(s)

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be counted on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative point-hour ratio required for the minor.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of course graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor

X193 credits No more than 3 credit hours.

Minor approval The minor course work must be approved by the academic unit offering the minor.

Filing the minor program form The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college/school counselor.

Changing the minor Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by the academic unit offering the minor.
