The Education Policy minor has three goals, which provide an interdisciplinary set of knowledge and skills. Upon successful completion of this minor, students will:

- Have advanced knowledge of public-sector policymaking, administrative processes, and policy analysis in the United States—particularly as they apply to the education system.
- Have knowledge of the history, substance, and social and political context of early-childhood, elementary, secondary, and post-secondary education in the U.S.
- Can describe current debates in education policy and the discuss the relative merits of policy options using evidence from high-quality research.

The undergraduate minor in Education Policy requires completion of a minimum of 15 credit hours. Students are required to take the 9 hours listed as foundational courses, and one course from each of the two categories below (for a total of 6 credits).

Special Topics Courses:

Nonprofit Management minor program guidelines

Credit hours required: A minimum of 15

<u>Transfer and EM credit hours allowed</u>: A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination

Overlap with the GE: Permitted, up to 6 hours.

Overlap with the major:

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- Each minor completed must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minors (i.e. minors that require more than 12 credit hours may overlap those hours beyond 12 with the major or with another minor,

Overlap between minors: Each minor completed must contain 12 unique hours.

Grades required:

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of courses graded
 Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor

<u>Approval required:</u> Please see your college advisor to declare the minor. The minor coursework must be approved by the academic unit offering the minor.

<u>Filing the minor program form:</u> The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college/school advisor.

<u>Changing the minor:</u> Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by a college/school advisor.
