The Local Government minor has three goals, which provide an interdisciplinary set of knowledge and skills. Upon successful completion of this minor, students will be able to:

- Understand financing of public services by state and local governments, including the fiscal relationships among local, state, and federal governments.
- Identify local government problems and apply analytical tools to address these problems.
- 3. Understand the basic legal framework, common structures, and functions of local governments.

The undergraduate minor in Local Government requires completion of a minimum of 15 credit hours. Given the requirements of the Glenn College's undergraduate majors, the curriculum of this minor will differ slightly depending on the student's program of study. Glenn College students will take three required courses and two electives, while non-Glenn College students will take four required courses and one elective.

<u>Transfer and EM credit hours allowed</u>: A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE Up to 6 hours.

Overlap with the major

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- Each minor completed must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minors (i.e. minors that require more than 12 credit hours may overlap those hours beyond 12 with the major or with another minor,

Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of courses graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor

<u>Approval required</u> The minor coursework must be approved by the academic unit offering the minor. Please see your college advisor to declare the minor.

<u>Filing the minor program form</u> The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college/school advisor.

<u>Changing the minor</u> Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by a college/school advisor.
